- The primary mission of the 'Fellowship in Minimal Access Surgery Gynecology' is to provide the skills to assume faculty and leadership positions in gynecology.
- Fellows will have access to Laparoscopic Knotting & Suturing training on Lap trainers.

The goals of the program include:

Patient Care:

- Advancement in the clinical skills of the trainee.
- Skill development includes experience in the essential hand-eye coordination, academic activity and operating experience and the special procedures of gynecology.

Teaching:

• To provide teaching skills that will allow the trainee to become an educator.

Research:

- To develop research skills that will allow independent investigation in either the basic sciences or clinical investigations.
- The qualified gynecologist will already have the necessary knowledge and experience in the pathophysiology, evaluation, diagnosis and current standard for management in all gynecological pathologies.
- This course will teach them the required knowledge about endoscopic equipments, operation theatre set up and the necessary skill development for performing the endoscopic surgeries that lead them to Fellowship in Gynecological Endoscopic Surgery.

Step 1:

Course starts with learning:

- Laparoscopic access techniques,
- Safe Trocar insertion, pneumo-peritoneum,
- Suturing and knotting,
- · Dissection techniques,
- Tissue retrieval techniques,
- Principles of baseball diamond concept of port position,
- Principles of safe use of various energy sources

Step 2:

Candidates should be adept with the following:

- Indications and contraindications for a given laparoscopic operation;
- The pertinent anatomy with regard to both an open technique and to a laparoscopic approach
- · The appropriate instrumentation;
- The technical plan, especially regarding trocar position, patient position, and the method to allow adequate exposure using traction and counter traction;
- The possible optional plans; and
- The possible associated complications to recognize and avoid any pitfalls.

Step 3:

Complete "Hands on Training of Laparoscopic and Hysteroscopic surgeries will be given for the following:

- Diagnostic Laparoscopy and Laparoscopic Sterilization
- Laparoscopic Management of Ovarian Cyst and fibroids
- Laparoscopic Salpingo-Oophorectomy
- Laparoscopic Management of Tubal Pregnancy
- Laparoscopic Assisted Vaginal Hysterectomy
- Laparoscopic Total Hysterectomy
- Supracervical Laparoscopic Hysterectomy
- Diagnostic Hysteroscopy
- Dissection for the retroperitoneum spaces
- Dissection for urogynecological procedures

- Review of Recorded Procedures with Faculty Input. (Specific/specialized videos)
- Grand Round / Clinical Case discussions/Journal Club, Round Table ii
- Discussions on imaging modality investigations.

E) Surgical ICU: (20 credit points)

Monitoring, postoperative management, procedures/skills and discussions

F) Operative Sessions Credits: (100 credit Points)

Operative Credits: A Candidate is expected to maintain certified Log book indicating number of cases assisted or individually done and managed under the guidance of faculty for each Module.

G) Fellowship Theory Examination: (50 Credit points)

 The examination for a particular course will be of MCQ type for judging overall proficiency of a Fellow.
